- Discuss special assessment techniques used in caring for a patient with an electrical injury.
- Outline the management principles of electrical injuries.
- Discuss the epidemiology of trauma.
- Describe the deranged physiology in trauma.
- Identify current and future treatments of traumatic injury.
- Identify what is best for patients with suspected spinal injury.
- Identify if age matters.
- Determine if current treatments work and/or cause harm.
- Describe what methods of extrication causes the least spinal movement.
- Describe what method of transport is most appropriate.
- Recognize physiologic differences in pediatric trauma patients.
- Identify patterns of abusive injury.
- Understand the importance of a complete trauma history.
- Learn common pitfalls in abuse diagnosis.
- Understanding your responsibilities as a mandatory reporter.
- Identify injury patterns for traumatic vertebral artery injury.
- Describe symptoms of carotid and vertebral artery injury.
- Identify complications associated with carotid and vertebral artery injuries.
